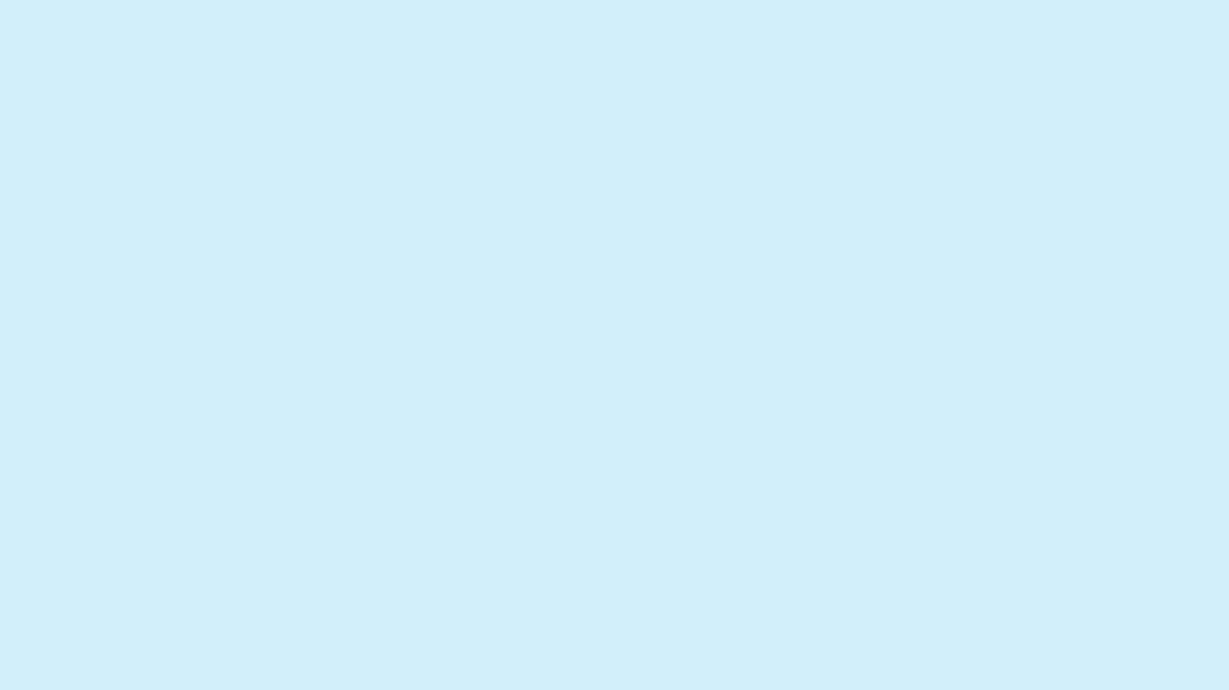

INTRODUCTION





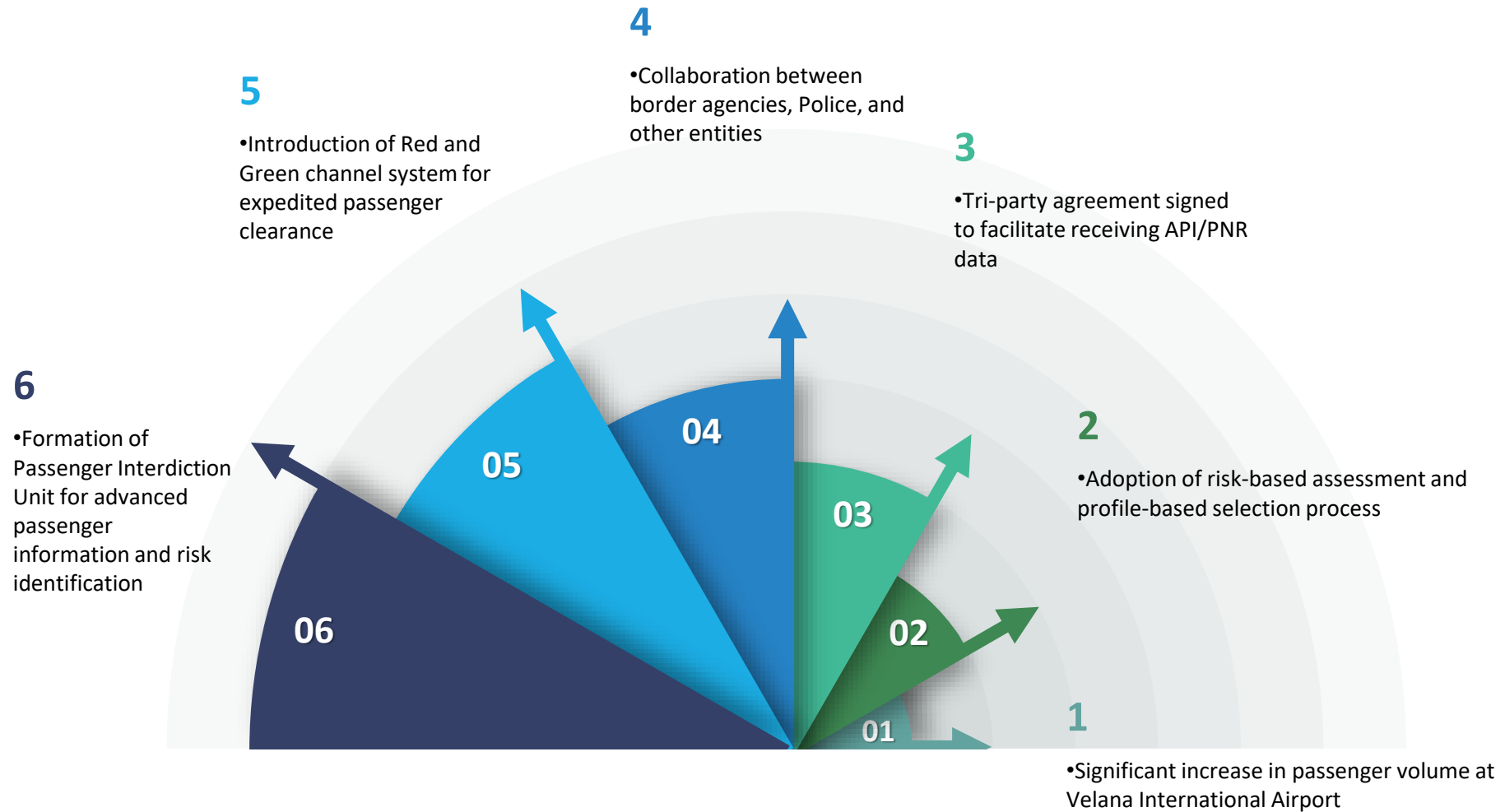
- Unique geographical formation poses challenges for border management in Maldives

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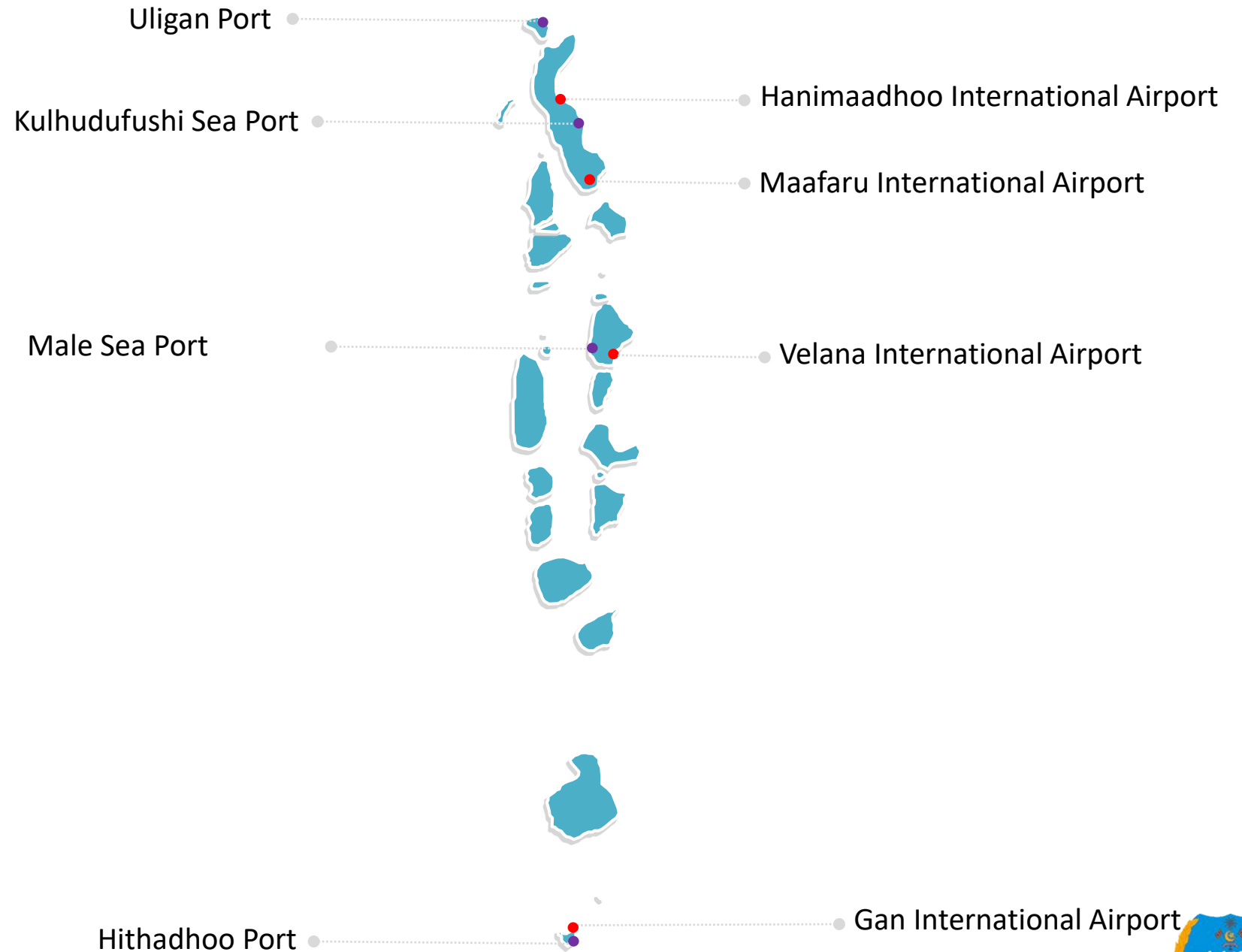

- Joint operations conducted with National Defense Force, Police, and Immigration
- National Counter Terrorism Center (NCTC) collaboration for data analysis
- Participation in Container Control Program (CCP) for sea border security

Coordinated Border Management Policy





- Commitment to implement coordinated border management policy
- Support from International Organization for Migration (IOM) in developing strategy
- Expansion of Customs focus from revenue collection to border management
- Adoption of World Customs Organization (WCO) guidelines for coordinated border management

Establishment of Passenger Interdiction Units (PIUs) at key entry points.



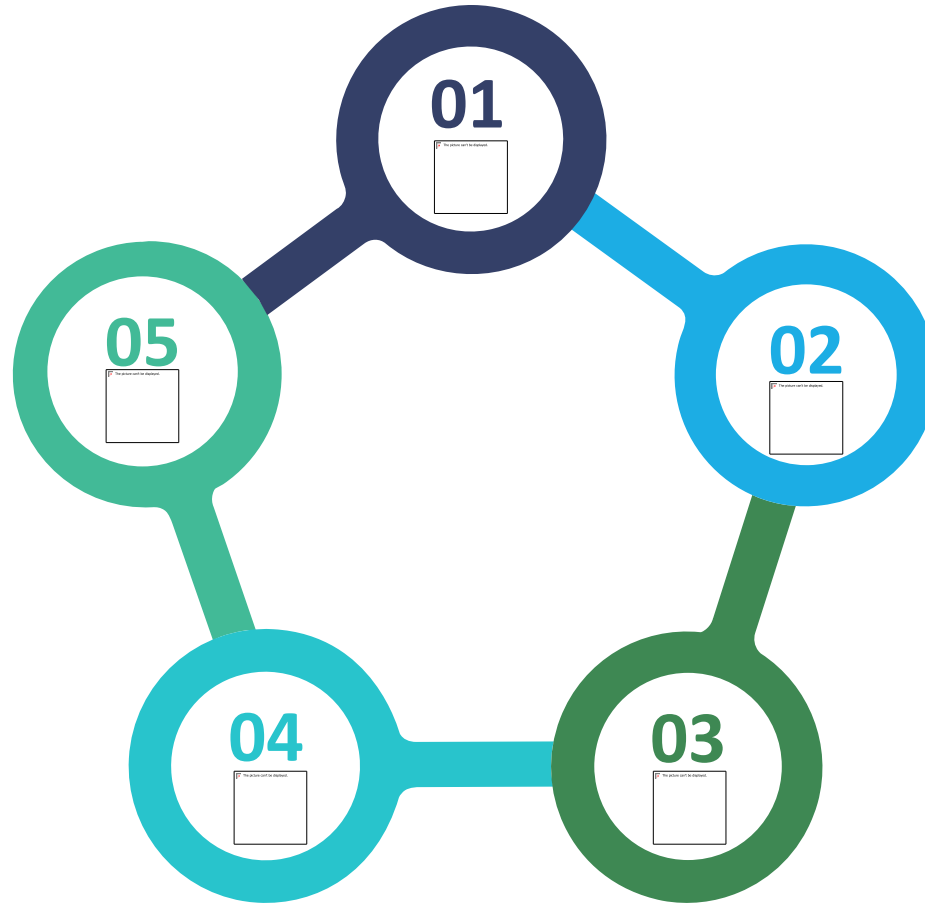
